A Thought for Parents - WHY CAMP?

I was reading a book today which says "And if you want some empirical evidence to back up that opinion [that our children are under siege in today's culture], listen to this: A study of college students seeking psychological counseling has found that their emotional difficulties are far more complex and more severe than those observed in the past. Researchers at Kansas State University studied students from 1989 to 2001 and concluded that those seeking help for depression doubled during that time period. Also, the percentage of students seeking some sort of psychiatric medication increased twofold."

Our children need a lot of support in this time in our country's history. The media, peers and very often the high school and college age role models with whom our children are surrounded are often concerned with self-pleasure, arrogance, rudeness, drugs, anger and more. I don't need to tell you what they are getting on TV and what is defined as "cool" and "trendy" by the world nowadays. Children need wholesome experiences more than ever. Some camps have been known as a place where a child gains confidence and new skills, but we feel the need to be more than that. We want to a place where our children are surrounded by positive role models who believe in goodness and wisdom. We want to be a respite for children who subscribe to these values and need support, endorsement and a place where they can take a break from the world's onslaught and feel safe simply being themselves. We want to show these ideals to children who haven't been in a place where they can see there is "another way" to live life. We want to help the parents in their goals and help the children that come to camp to develop coping skills, to learn to enjoy life for the gift it is and have it abundantly.

We hear from so many parents in countless notes, thank you letters and phone calls that camp is blessed with a combination that works wonders. I'll never forget one parent asking me, "What did you do to my kids?" I was concerned. What happened that I missed? I said, hesitantly, "Well we loved them and treated them with respect." Then I asked, "What do you mean?" and he said, to my relief, "They came home and didn't bicker for three weeks!" That is a hint of what we live to do. Others have talked about the growth in their children and about the many life changing affirmations their children




